Clayton Baultrippe was born in Cleveland, Ohio to Clay and Joyce (Ballentine) Baultrippe on September 7, 1957. He was always known as a sweet, loving, and kind young man, as his grandmother once recalled, affectionately calling him “Little Clay-ton.” He also did an amazing James Brown impression as a kid.

He attended Cleveland Public Schools and graduated from John Marshall High School in 1976. Clayton began his career at Ford Motor Company in Cleveland, Ohio in 1977 and retired from the St. Paul Ford Plant in 2012 after 35 years. He served in a few leadership positions while working at Ford and gained many lifelong friends among his co-workers.

He will always be remembered for his legacy of love, generosity, enjoying The Great Outdoors and being the grill master. Clayton’s favorite past-time was fishing and boating, but his joy for sports shined through every week during Sunday football games. His laughter would light up any room and his warmth embraced all who met him.

Clayton was preceded in death by his beautiful children, Jasmine and Julian Baultrippe; his sisters Debbie Baultrippe and Wanda Johnson; his parents Clay and Joyce Baultrippe; and his grandparents, Albert and Ethel Ballentine. 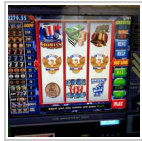
