“ I am a special education teacher at Armatage School. My class size is small, but my students often have the most significant learning and behavior needs. I rely on the building engineers more than most teachers, so I always make an effort to establish a good relationship. When Robert joined the Armatage staff, I didn't hesitate to "get in good" with him. But there was no need; Robert was kind, patient and dependable the moment we met. I can still hear his voice every time I sheepishly asked for something: "Don't worry. I got you." And he did; my students always had what they needed.

I have a tendency to work late. One evening Robert came to clean my classroom at 7p. He wanted to know why I was still at work. I could see he wasn't happy. "I thought the building was open until 8p," I said. "Yeah, it is - for ME. Teachers gotta be out by 6." I apologized profusely and hurriedly packed my belongings and left. It would be a far cry to say Robert was angry. He used a stern voice, that was about it. Two days later, I found a note on my desk from Robert. He had written it on a large sheet of paper with a bold, black marker to be sure I would see it. He told me I could continue to work as late as 8p. I thanked Robert profusely when I saw him. I also teased him a bit, saying it would probably have been better for my mental health had he insisted I always leave by 6.

That was the thing about Robert; he was easy to talk to and easy to laugh with. He also had the best taste in music! Late at night, with no one but Robert and I in the school, I could hear the music he chose to play. Sometimes he even played songs from way back in my youth! He had a good ear for the new and the classic.

Robert was young enough to be my son, but I always thought of him like the big brother I wished I'd had. I enjoyed his company, and it always touched my heart the way he looked out for me and my students. I am going to miss him dearly.

I know my grief doesn't compare to that of Robert's family. My Dad

passed in April 2023, so I may know some of what you feel. A wise man told me, "I know it's hard, but try to remember, it's not about the beginning or the end, it's about the journey." When I thanked him for his kind words, he said, "We are all on this earth to help each other." We certainly wish Robert's journey had been much longer, but I find comfort knowing Robert fulfilled his journey - he was always there to help others.
